

Utah Surgical Center Instructions

Your procedure will be scheduled on:

Your post-operative checkup appointment will be scheduled for: ____

Please follow the pre-registration instructions listed on the attached instruction sheet. Once you have completed the online registration, a nurse from the surgical center will call you to review your medical history, medications, and give you instructions for the day before your procedure. Utah Surgical Center will contact you the day before your scheduled procedure to verify your arrival time the day of your procedure. If your procedure is scheduled on a Monday, they will contact you on Friday.

Remember, you will need a driver to take you home after your procedure.

Important Reminders:

- Please inform the office staff if you are taking any blood thinning medications such as Coumadin, Lovenox, Plavix, or medication to control blood pressure.
- Do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your procedure.
- Listed above is the date and time for your scheduled post-operative checkup appointment. If you have a conflict with that appointment or you do not have a checkup appointment scheduled, please call the office within 2 days after your procedure to schedule an appointment with Dr. Hollingsed. We will need to see you back 5-10 days after your procedure.
- If you need to cancel or reschedule your surgery/procedure, please contact our office as soon as possible.

Please be aware that we cannot guarantee surgery/procedure times. Due to the nature of surgeries/ procedures scheduled at this facility, schedule is not finalized until 1 day before.

Surgery schedules for Mondays are finalized on Fridays.

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1. Eating Restrictions: Do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your surgery. This includes solid foods, gum, candy, liquids, and dairy products of any kind.

Why can't I have anything to eat or drink after midnight the night before my procedure?

Because anything in your stomach may cause serious, even life threatening complications when having anesthesia. If you have anything to eat or drink, your procedure may be rescheduled.

- Medications Please follow instructions given to you by your pre-operative nurse.
- Children less than two years old can have sugar water up to three hours before surgery.

2. Personal Hygiene and Appearance for Day of Surgery:

- Take a bath or shower either the night before or morning of your surgery.
- Brush your teeth, being careful to not swallow any liquid.
- **Wear loose-fitting clothing** that will be easy to remove and will fit over bandages and splints. Please do not wear jeans or denim of any kind.
- **Do not apply makeup or hair products** of any kind. Lotions and deodorants should not be applied to any area near the surgery site.
- Jewelry All watches, rings, necklaces, earrings, and body piercings of any kind must be removed prior to surgery. Please leave them at home.
- **Remove contact** lenses prior to surgery. Bring eyeglasses if needed to read and sign your forms.
- No Shaving. If you cut yourself, it could cause an infection.
- **3.** Please call us the day before your surgery to discuss:
 - Time of surgery and medical history. To receive your pre-operative instructions and to review your medical history with our staff. You will be asked to arrive an hour prior to surgery to complete and sign consent forms.
 - Medical Condition If you have any serious medical problems or have recently developed a cold, fever, sore throat, or any other condition that you believe might affect your readiness for surgery, please tell us during your telephone interview.

Items to bring with you:

- Your Photo ID (a driver's license, state ID, or passport)
- Insurance card(s), if applicable.

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- **Cash or a credit card** for your deductibles, co-pays/co-insurance, or self-pay procedure (you will be required to make a payment on the day of your surgery if your insurance does not cover your surgery in full).
- Bring the completed **<u>Pre-Registration Demographics</u>** form on day of surgery.
- Cases for eyeglasses, contact lenses and solution, dentures, or hearing aids as you may be asked to remove these items when you dress for the procedure.
- If you are on oxygen or use a CPAP/BIPAP at home (and are having general anesthesia), please bring it with you.
- 4. Please limit only one adult visitor per patient and one or both parents for children under 18.
- 5. Please **DO NOT** bring small children if possible.
- 6. Anesthesia may be discussed with your anesthesiologist prior to going into surgery. The type of anesthesia falls into three categories:
 - Local Anesthesia is an injection of a numbing medicine at the operative site.
 - Regional Anesthesia is an injection to numb an entire limb or lower body.
 - General Anesthesia is medicine given through an IV catheter to ease you to sleep after which you breathe an anesthetic to keep you asleep.
 - You may also receive medicine through an IV to help you relax during local and regional anesthesia.
